Monrovia, Monday, October 11 - San Gabriel Valley Habitat for Humanity (SGV Habitat) is one of more than 220 Habitat organizations awarded a grant from Wells Fargo as part of its nationwide initiative to help low-to-moderate income families construct and improve homes across the country. The \$30,000 grant will help create and maintain affordable housing throughout the region.
